61 - Rainforest

Did you know scientists estimate there are up to 50 million species living in the rainforest? But what exactly is the rainforest? What makes it one of the most unique places on Earth? And why is it so crucial to our planet's survival?

There are two classifications of rainforests: Tropical and Temperate. Tropical rainforests are located close to the Earth's equator. They remain warm, and frost free, all year, with temperatures between 70 and 85 degrees Fahrenheit. In fact, Florida has some tropical rainforests, as do Hawaii and Puerto Rico.

Temperate rainforests have consistently mild temperatures - but on the cooler side. They are more likely to have evergreen trees, and other needled, pine-type varieties. Whereas the tropical rainforest is known for having trees and plants with bigger, wider leaves. Although temperate rainforests have less species of trees -- theirs tend to live longer -- sometimes 500-1000 years!

The US also has temperate rainforests too, such as North Carolina's Appalachian Mountains, California's Redwood Forest, Alaska's Chugach National Forest, and the Olympic Peninsula in Washington.
